Operation Christmas Child time is here! These shoeboxes are just the beginning of a relationship with each of these children and can lead them to salvation.

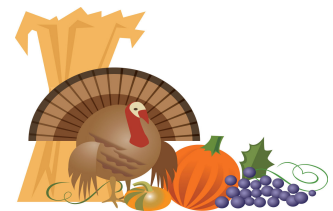

Right Wing, or Left Wing

James 2:20-26 (NIV)

²⁰ You foolish man, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless? ²¹ Was not our ancestor Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar? ²² You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did. ²³ And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend. ²⁴ You see that a person is justified by what he does and not by faith alone. ²⁵ In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? ²⁶ As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.

Faith vs. works has always been a hot topic among Christians, as we try to figure out which is most important. Paul spends most of the book of Ephesians explaining that we are saved through faith, not works. "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God — not by works, so that no one can boast." (Ephesians 2:8–9, NIV). However, in the verses above, James very clearly indicates that faith without works is useless. Some might think that Paul and James are at odds. So who is right? They both are. They are *both* right. But their audiences were different.

Paul was writing to new and to potentially new Christians. Paul was explaining that our salvation comes only through the grace of what God did through Jesus Christ and the faith that we put in Him. Grace is unmerited favor, while mercy is *not* getting what you deserve. God's grace, or God's undeserved/unearned favor toward us, resulted in Him sending Jesus to pay for our sins. As we accept that payment for, and thus forgiveness of, our sins, and put our faith in Him, we receive His salvation. We have faith in God's promises and faith that He will do what

He said He would do. The Bible often talks about the 'hope' we have in Christ. This hope is for our future in eternity and is a certainty, because it only depends on the all-powerful, almighty God, and not on us.

James, on the other hand, was writing to more mature Christians. Sure, you've seen this. You've seen people who have just met Jesus and are on fire for Him. They worship, they serve, they are growing in their relationship with Christ! Then after awhile, they cool off. They forget the depth of what Christ did for them. They begin to get lazy and begin to simply rest on their faith. James was telling them to get off their 'blessed assurance' and get to work! Paul also agreed with this as he wrote in the verse just after the one mentioned above: "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (Ephesians 2:10, NIV)

James was also telling them that the only way to know that their faith was real was to see its results. James mentions Abraham and the way his life reflected his faith. He also mentions Rahab, who risked her life to save God's servants. James was saying that if you are saved – if you do have a saving faith – then it will show in your life by the way you live and what you do. Think about it. If God's Holy Spirit is inside of you, then it should show! There is a story about a little girl that asked her mother, "Is God inside me now?" "Yes," her mother said. "God is really big, right?" "Right!" said mom. "Then if He's inside me and He's really big, won't He stick out?"

It really is true. If God is inside of you, He should show somewhere! So, we find that faith is necessary for our initial acceptance of Jesus' salvation, and works are the result of the faith inside of us. Dr. Buckner Fanning was once asked, "Which is more important; faith or works?" To which he replied, "Which is more important, the left wing of an airplane or the right one?"

Find a way to allow God to stick out this week!

There are 14 million Jews in the world today. 7 million live in Israel. Of these 68% are *sabras*—Jews born and living in Israel. (Term is actually derived from our prickly pear cactus—tough and thorny on the outside but soft and sweet on the inside). Worldwide there are 300,000 Jews who have accepted Jesus as Lord and Savior. In Israel there are 15,000 Christian Jews. Evangelical groups like Jews for Jesus work in cities with large Jewish populations. Their work results in 70% Gentile converts and 30% Jewish. Evangelical or Messianic Jewish congregations are widespread, including one in San Antonio. Religious surveys in Israel today show Atheism as the largest group. Still they are God's chosen people, and we need to pray for them every day (Deuteronomy 7:7-8).

The book of Revelation tells us that at a point in the Tribulation "all of Israel will be saved." All of you are familiar with the "Roman Road to Salvation." If the Holy Spirit gives you an opportunity to witness to a Jewish person use the Isaiah Road, because these are verses that virtually all Jews are familiar with: Jeremiah 29:11-13, Isaiah 59:2-3, Isaiah 53:5-7, and Joel 2:32. I don't have these memorized, but each is highlighted and they are written in the front flyleaf of my Bible. Always be ready (1 Peter 3:15).

One of Israel's problems today is the Palestinians. These are descendants of the Philistines and were called Philistines until circa 1917. Israel did not follow God's instructions when they moved into the Promised Land. Realize there never was a country named Palestine. After WWI the Ottoman Empire collapsed, The League of Nations asked Great Britain and France to manage protectorates that included parts of Iraq, Syria, Jordan, present-day Israel, Egyptian Sinai and Gaza. The British chose the name Palestine Mandate for the territory. The home of the Philistines is today known as the Gaza strip, which includes four large cities. Almost daily they fire rockets and missiles from Gaza into Israel aiming at cities in the south. They recently petitioned the UN to have a separate state of Palestine declared. Fierce behind the scenes wrangling by the US and Israel got it stopped.

An Israeli soldier, Gilad Shalit that was captured by the terrorist group Hamas in a cross border raid and held for over five years, was just released in exchange for over 1,000 Philistine prisoners. Over 400 of these were serving life sentences for murder of Israeli civilians. This sets a dangerous precedent. Hamas now says they can capture enough soldiers to get the other 8,000 prisoners freed. Prime Minister Netanyahu told the Philistines just before they were released that if they return to being terrorists, their blood is on their own heads.
